This two story residence exemplifies the Dutch Colonial architectural style with its gambrel roof, continuous dormers and one story asymmetrical wing. Unusual features are its one story garage on the west side (which creates a bilateral symmetry) and neo-classical entrance with fan motif above the door, Doric pilasters and heavy bracketing. Also note the window shutters which appear to be original.

The first floor of the house contains a sunroom, living room, dining room and kitchen. Note the folding French doors and hardwood floors throughout the first floor. The typical one story wing creates an east-facing sunroom off the living room of this house.

The second floor of the house contains two bedrooms and a bath. The bath has a pedestal sink, ceramic floor and oversized bathtub. Unusual are the windows in the closets. Their placement is to retain the exterior symmetry of the building. Also of note is that all the windows of the house are original double-hung windows with eight panes on top and a single pane bottom.
