



MASONIC TEMPLE
310 E. CHICAGO STREET

The Masonic Temple was built in 1924. This structure reflects the Beaux Arts movement of the 1920's. Typical of the Beaux Arts classicism is the strong massing, prominent pediment, Ionic pilasters and triangular pediments over the windows. Constructed by local contractor John A. Wright, the building cost \$300,000 when constructed and contains an auditorium with a seating capacity for 2,500 persons.
